## Conservative Party - political party, United Kingdom

Conservative Party, byname Tories, in the United Kingdom, a political party whose guiding
principles include the promotion of private property and enterprise, the maintenance of a
strong military, and the preservation of traditional cultural values and institutions. Since
World War I the Conservative Party and its principal opponent, the Labour Party, have
dominated British political life.
