What is Art?

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## First paragraph:

So, after you've made your assertion, based on your research, it could be time for you to reformat your original sentence, if you so choose. You could do it with something like the following: ...In other words, art is expression, creativity, which means creating something new, but it is art because everyone will have a disparate (don't use basic words: different, nice, good, funny...) perception on the particular subject matter, no matter how large or small.

Second paragraph:

I don't understand the first sentence because I can't read it.

Oh, I see that you are confused as to how to make a paragraph. You just throw in Dada art in the second paragraph, then you define it in the third, but the first reference doesn't have any meaning to the paragraph's introduction, which was: 'Art, because the art says it's art (??).
